Upon submission of this request, the Clinical Psychology Department Administrator will review the student's coursework to ensure eligibility for the examination. The student will receive confirmation that she or he has fulfilled all of the requirements to sit for the exam, or will receive a letter indicating deficiencies that need to be addressed before the student will be allowed to sit for the exam.

It is the policy of Argosy University, Chicago to make reasonable accommodations for qualified students with disabilities, in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). If a student with disabilities needs accommodations to complete the exam, the student must notify the Director of Career Services. Procedure for documenting student disability and the development of reasonable accommodation will be provided to students upon request. Submission of approved ADA accommodations must be submitted to the Clinical Psychology Department Administrator prior to the start of the comprehensive exams in order to receive accommodations for the exam.

Please note that the exam is given in January with a make-up offered in May. As of May 2008, any section of the exam which a student passes does not need to be re-taken. Beginning in January 2009, students who are taking the comprehensive exam for the first time will be given three opportunities to pass each section of the exam. Failure to fully pass all three sections of the comprehensive exam after three tries will result in dismissal from the program. For students who first took the comprehensive exam prior to January 2009, previous policies will apply regarding the number of times that a student may take the exam. Please note that the number of times that a student may "take" the exam refers to a graded exam. If a student picks up the exam, but does not submit the exam, or the exam is not graded, this will not count as an attempt to pass the exam.
