These meetings provide supervisors with a forum to enhance their supervisory efforts with liners, discuss caller issues, and receive basic training in theories and approaches to clinical supervision.

The time commitment is a **minimum of 3 hours/week for at least 6 months. The maximum time would be up to 15 hours/week.**

Supervisors provide direct, real-time supervision and consultation to trained hotline volunteers (they receive training noted above) as they provide crisis and support counseling to callers.

Supervisors have opportunities to facilitate group discussion of caller issues, clinical approaches, hotline administrative functions, and professional issues with hotline volunteers during their shifts.

Supervisors also assist “big sibs” (advanced volunteers) in their efforts to carry out supervisory and mentoring roles on the hotline. These tasks provide some experience providing supervision of supervision.

Supervisors assist “big sibs” with administrative oversight of hotline functions during their shifts (i.e., tracking liner attendance, completion of paperwork, etc.).

Supervisors may also have opportunities to participate in outreach, for example, giving presentations about the hotline in classes at the university, local hospitals, community centers, etc.
