The basic requirements for employment as a VHA psychologist are prescribed by: Public Law 96-151 codified in Title 38, U.S.C. § 7402. To qualify for appointment, all applicants for the position of psychologist in VHA must meet the following:

a. **Citizenship.** Citizen of the United States. (Non-citizens may be appointed when it is not possible to recruit qualified citizens in accordance with chapter 3, section A, paragraph 3g, this part.)

b. **Education**

(1) Have a doctoral degree in psychology from a graduate program in psychology accredited by the American Psychological Association (APA). The specialty area of the degree must be consistent with the assignment for which the applicant is to be employed.

AND

(2) Have successfully completed a professional psychology internship training program that has been accredited by APA. Exceptions: (1) new VHA psychology internship programs that are in the process of applying for APA accreditation are acceptable in fulfillment of the internship requirement, provided that such programs were sanctioned by the VHA Central Office Program Director for Psychology and the VHA Central Office of Academic Affiliations at the time that the individual was an intern and (2) VHA facilities who offered full one-year pre-doctoral internships prior to PL 96-151 (pre-1979) are considered to be acceptable in fulfillment of the internship requirement.

(c) **Licensure.** Hold a full, current, and unrestricted license to practice psychology at the doctoral level in a State, Territory, Commonwealth of the United States (e.g., Puerto Rico), or the District of Columbia.

Exception. The Secretary may waive the requirement of licensure for an individual psychologist for a period not to exceed 2 years from the date of employment on the condition that such a psychologist provide care only under the supervision of a psychologist who is so licensed. Non-licensed psychologists who otherwise meet the eligibility requirements may be given a temporary appointment as a graduate psychologist under the authority of 38 U.S.C. § 7405 (a) (1) (D). Failure to obtain licensure during that period is justification for termination of the temporary appointment. This may result in termination of employment.

(d) **Loss of Credential.** An employee in this occupation who fails to obtain licensure/certification/registration within the required time frame, or who fails to maintain the required licensure/certification/registration must be removed from the occupation, which may also result in termination of employment.

Job Description

The psychologist will serve as the program manager for a long-term residential treatment program for women veterans with PTSD and other mental health or substance use problems, and as a staff psychologist in the Women's Stress Disorder Treatment Team (WSDTT) on the Boston campus of the VA Boston Healthcare System (VABHS). As the program manager for the residential program, the psychologist will have responsibility for the daily operations of the program, outreach, consult management, clinical care

including screenings, assessments, discharge evaluations, and treatment planning, establishing policies and procedures, preparing for accreditation and regulatory reviews, conducting program evaluation and supervising program staff. The psychologist will also function as a member of our nationally-recognized WSDTT, and will provide direct clinical care for women veterans in this program. The psychologist must have experience with evidence-based approaches to assessment and treatment of PTSD (e.g., CPT, PE) as well as with treatment of a wide range of co-occurring mental health problems and substance use disorders in female patients, and must have excellent skills in working collaboratively as part of a team. The psychologist will also play an active role in the psychology training program through provision of didactics and supervision of trainees and will be encouraged to participate in research.

Supervisors also assist “big sibs” (advanced volunteers) in their efforts to carry out supervisory and mentoring roles on the hotline. These tasks provide some experience providing supervision of supervision.

Supervisors assist “big sibs” with administrative oversight of hotline functions during their shifts (i.e., tracking liner attendance, completion of paperwork, etc.).

Supervisors may also have opportunities to participate in outreach, for example, giving presentations about the hotline in classes at the university, local hospitals, community centers, etc.

Supervisors may have the opportunity to gain teaching experience by providing guest lecturers or facilitating role-play groups for the PSCH 386 course.
