Note:

- A. The Counselor Education Department offers courses in a variety of formats in order to accommodate the scheduling needs of the students as well as the nature of the course. No matter in which format the courses are delivered, they all meet the instructional standards set forth by the Higher Learning Commission, that is, for every academic credit, there will be a 15 hours of instructional time with the course. This also implies that sections of courses which may be offered in different time frame and format, they all achieve same educational goals, and the amount of the work that the students are doing for the course will be compatible and similar.
- B. Courses in the MACC program are non-sequential other than the first three courses which should be taken in the first 1 to 1½ semesters. Practicum prerequisites should be taken within the first year of study. These 7 courses are considered foundational for the other courses in the program.

** Denotes prerequisite courses for PC6410 Practicum Seminar and PC6415 Internship Seminar. Students must successfully complete these courses 1 term prior to beginning the Practicum/Internship experience. A minimum grade of "B-" is required. If a student scores below a "B-" the course must be retaken and satisfactorily completed with a grade of "B-" or higher in order to qualify for Practicum/Internship.*
