

Guidelines for Spring Registration – students should pay close attention to the degree audit for their program and term of entry (these are located on the clinical psych webpage). In addition to following the audit, there are a few additional considerations when planning your schedule.

Students who are on practicum this training year

- Remember that your practicum seminar time cannot be changed. You'll need to build your spring schedule (and plan your summer schedules) around your practicum seminar assignment.
- You will be automatically registered for practicum in the spring term, though this may not show up on your schedule until late in the fall term.

PsyD students who started in fall 2009 or later

- PsyD students who started fall 2009 or later should plan to take Research Methods and Statistics during the second year in order to complete the pre-requisites for PP8499 CRP Proposal Development, which will be taken during fall of the third year. Student who intend to take longer to complete the PsyD, you do not need to take these courses during your second year in the program.
- Students who started the PsyD program in fall 2010 and are planning on pursuing the intensive 4 year track will need to take Statistics and Research Methods during the first year.
- Note that Research Methods is not offered in the summer term.

Important information about the Research Methods courses offered in spring 2011

- When the PsyD curriculum changed in fall 2009 to include the CRP Proposal Development course, the Research Methods curriculum also changed to accommodate this new class. However, as we still have students taking Research Methods who entered the program under the old curriculum, there are two versions of Research Methods offered. While all students are permitted to take either version, we believe it is most beneficial for students who will not take PP8499 to take the "old" version of Research Methods and students who will take PP8499 to take the "new" version.
- The new version of research methods (recommended for students who started the program in fall 2009 or later) will be offered at the following times: Dr. Miller's Wednesday section 12:30-3:15 or Dr. Leifer's Thursday section 12:30-3:15
- The old version of Research Methods (recommended for students who started the program prior to fall 2009) will be offered at the following time: Dr. Leifer's Wednesday section 12:30-3:15
- After this spring term, only the new version of Research Methods will be offered

CRP Enrollment

- As a reminder, to register for CRP, students must submit the CRP chair declaration form to the Registrar, Tyler Shippen
- Once a student is registered for CRP, the student must remain continuously registered each term until the final draft is complete.
- Students will be automatically registered for CRP each term, until the final draft signature sheet is submitted to Tyler Shippen
- Students must complete Statistics and Research Methods and CRP Proposal Development (for fall 2009 or later entering students) before registering for CRP

MACL Students planning to apply to the PsyD program

- Note that, if you are planning to start the PsyD program in fall 2011 and finish in 3 years, you will need to take Research Methods and Statistics during your second year in the MACL program. This is in order to complete the pre-requisites for PP8499 CRP Proposal Development, which will be taken during the fall of your first year in the PsyD program. If you intend to take longer to complete the PsyD, you do not need to take these courses during your MA program.
- Also, MA students will need to complete the Assessment series (PP7370, PP7371, and PP7372) during the second year of the MA program in order to be eligible for Dx practicum in fall of the first year in the PsyD program. Note that MA students cannot register for PP7372 until the summer term. MA students may be allowed in PP7372 in the spring term if there are open seats after the PsyD students have registered.

Planning for PsyD comps

- For PsyD students on the 4 year track, you will need to complete all comps pre-requisites by the end of the second year to be comps eligible.
- PsyD students on the 5 year track will need to complete all comps prerequisites by the end of the 3rd year to be comps eligible. It is possible, with careful planning and successful registration, to complete all pre-reqs and take comps after the second year, but we do not recommend students pursue this route.

MACL Portfolio Course

- Second year MA students who have elected to follow the new MACL curriculum will need to register for the MACL Portfolio course in spring.
- The Portfolio course is only offered during the spring term.
- This class will meet every other week for 2 hours. Students sign up for a class based on a time that fits for them.
